

## Frequently Asked Questions

### Conference Summer Housing

**Q: How do I get to campus from the Airport, Bus Station, or Train Station?**

**A:** Taxis are a cheap and easy way to get to campus. They are typically waiting outside of the airport, bus and train stations. Most taxi drivers are familiar with the University, but you may want to download a campus map before arriving in Rochester:

The Rochester city buses also stop at several locations on the River Campus as well as the Medical Center and Eastman campus. The RTS bus will also be useful for exploring Rochester and getting to area shopping & attractions during your stay. **Q: Where do I check in to my summer housing room?**

**A:** Each residential area has a summer housing office where you will need to check in and receive your keys, ID card, and housing information.

Area offices are open during peak check-in periods and have regular daily hours for guest services. If your area office is not open when you arrive, you will find instructions posted on the door for paging the on-duty summer assistant. The staff lives in your housing area and will respond to your page within a few short minutes.

**Q: What items should I bring with me to Rochester?**

**A:** In addition to the usual personal items (toiletries and such), you may want to bring things to make your space cozier including lamps, clock, stereo, television, and kitchen items including pots, pans, and cleaning supplies (each residence hall has kitchen facilities available for your use). Residence Halls are not air-conditioned, so a fan will be useful during the hot summer months. If you have not purchased a linen package through the Conference & Events office, be sure to bring bed linens, towels, washcloths, etc...
